To meet the requirements of the program you need to be NOT covered by any medical prescription plan and your income needs to be \$19,000 or lower for a single individual and no more than \$25,000 for a couple. Your medications need to be for a chronic or ongoing illness since once accepted you are enrolled for a year at a time. It is best if your medication dosage is stable. Not all medications are covered by the National Pharmaceutical Assistance program. An \$8 fee is charged to cover postage and handling but can be waived depending on individual circumstances.
